BORN & RAISED BREEDERS

We are once again holding a Born and Raised program for goats and are happy that you have signed up to be a breeder. If you have not registered, please do so quickly. The annual membership fee for breeders is \$40. Once your application has been received and your payment processed, your name will be placed on the breeders list for distribution to all 4-H/FFA exhibitors. Your \$40 fee includes membership into the Butler County Meat Goat Association which entitles you to reduced event fees, breeder/farm advertising and educational opportunities. BORN & RAISED (Market Goat) RULES – Butler County Fair

To qualify, an entry must be the prodigy of a doe that resides within Butler County. The goat kid must be born and raised in Butler County or a county school district. The exhibitor must be a Butler County Jr. Fair Exhibitor and must have possession of their animal by May 1st of the current year. The goat kid must be purchased directly from a current registered Butler County Born & Raised Breeder in order to qualify.

Born & Raised Breeders will be required to register and collect fees from potential exhibitors. Once registered, you will receive your packet and instructions. These are due to BCMGA by 5/13/23.

We look forward to a successful 2023 fair year and are very excited to have the opportunity to include the Born & Raised Program again.
